
Open Day

Lastly, I just have one small thing I would like to add to my column before finishing up with this edition of the Newsletter. I was personally disappointed and to some extent upset on behalf of the majority of members in relation to the rubbish pile outside of the clubhouse and its growth over the Christmas period.

You will recall we had a clean-up at the last Social/Workday where a number of items were removed from around hangars the bush areas of the club and stacked in the parking area for dispatch to the dump.

OK, we had a few issues with some members who were concerned that we put some of their belongings (that were left "outside their hangars") on the pile, and therefore it was decided to postpone the removal of the rubbish for a few weeks so those people could return their items to their hangars and stow them away.

Anyway, that was not actually the disappointing part... The disappointing part was that it took us longer than expected to get a contractor to actually deliver a bin on site, and subsequently, a few members decided that this was the perfect opportunity to bring in rubbish from their homes, or clean out their hangars and add it to the pile, which was not really the intention of the airfield clean-up.

I would ask that in the future, should we have a rubbish collection again (and I believe we will), that any rubbish from your homes be left at home and not brought into the club for removal. It is grossly unfair on the rest of the club members be expected to have to pay the bill to have your household rubbish removed. Likewise, it's not the member's responsibility to bear the cost of cleaning out your hangar either.

For the record, the items that were loaded into the bin

included:

- a treadmill.
- two lawn mowers,
- a number of chairs, including deck chairs,
- window frames,
- a sink,
- drums of old engine oil,
- bedding materials including pillows, blankets and sheets.
- bits and pieces of cars, from seats to body parts,
- an old stereo unit and, the list goes on.

Still to be removed from this area (at the time of writing this) are a number of plastic and metal containers, some steal and roofing material, and there is even a set of moulds from someone's cowling for their aircraft.

Apart from the obvious lack of consideration for fellow members, this unfortunately meant that the cost of removing this rubbish was increased from what was expected to be around \$250.00 to \$300.00, to somewhere in the vicinity of \$1000.00. I say "in the vicinity" as so far we have parted with \$700.00 and there is still some rubbish to be removed, and I do not have the final cost for this as such—but I am expecting a final bill of around \$1000.00 or so, when all is said and done.

Anyway, I don't want to harp on it, but again, I would ask that everyone be mindful of their actions and the flow-on effect of cost to the club membership as a result of such actions.

I look forward to seeing you at the next Social/Workday on the 3rd of May.


